#### **Early years**

#### Nursery

During the past couple of months in the cloud class we have been reading the story 'The bear hunt'. The children have become very familiar with the story; they can order it using pictures and can help tell parts of it using new English vocabulary. They learned important position words through this story such as 'over', 'under' and 'through'. During P.E. they acted out the story using gross motor skills.

The cloud class have spent some weeks observing the life cycle of a butterfly. They have watched the small caterpillars grow in size, make cocoons and they emerge as beautiful butterflies. When they were strong enough we all went down to the forest to set the butterflies free, the children were all quiet and careful respecting the fragility of the butterflies.

During art sessions the cloud class have been experimenting with paints and mixing colours. We looked at the primary colours and the children made predictions about which colour pairs would mix to make which colours. They all observed how the primary colours turn into secondary colours when mixed together.

The topic this term has been weather and the Cloud class spent week looking at rainbows, we learned that rainbows usually come out when it has been raining and then the sun comes out. We hung some prisms in the windows to create our own rainbows which now shine around our class.

#### Reception

The children in the Rainbow Class have had an exciting summer term, learning about caterpillars and the life cycle of a butterfly. Some caterpillars arrived in our classroom and from these, they developed into cocoons. After a few weeks, the butterflies emerged out of the cocoons and the children in the class helped to feed and look after them. They carefully observed the life cycle process, drew pictures of the cocoons and butterflies and learnt new vocabulary such as "egg," "cocoon" and "butterfly" to explain the life cycle. The Rainbow class enjoyed watching as the butterflies were released in the forest and fly off into their natural environment.

During our P.E. sessions this term, the children have started putting their P.E. skills into practise, by taking part in and practising different Sports Day activities. They have also been learning the importance of having fun and trying our best, rather than the competitiveness and desire to come first. They are beginning to understand the idea of "good sportsmanship" and continuing their learning about being a successful team member. Well done to all the Rainbow Class for your brilliant efforts competing in Sports Day! I was particularly impressed by all of the children's enthusiasm when cheering for their friends and displaying good sportsmanship.

With the weather heating up, the children have had fun using the swimming pool and playing water games. The Rainbow class enjoyed socialising with the other children in Key Stage 1 and developing their friendships too!

#### **Key Stage II - Year 5**

We have had several memorable moments this year in the Surging Tsunami class. Here are some highlights from the last term. On Friday, 7th June, Key Stage 2 ventured to Club Vela in Canet. It was fortunate that the sun was shining brightly. The wonderful activities that were organized paved the way for many memorable moments! Firstly, we played on the beach. We constructed volcanoes in the sand that we had studied in class. We also designed coastal management strategies that we had become familiar with in topic class. Once we were given permission, we ran as fast as the wind to the paddle board and catamaran. We put on our life jackets and divided ourselves up into groups. As happy as Larry, we set sail and we laughed for the duration of the adventure. As we waited to change from one vessel to another, we dived in and helped each other back on the board. Everyone behaved impeccably well and Pablo, our sports man of the day, assisted us all with his impressive sailing skills. It was a day that will be forever etched in our memories.

On Monday, 10th June, we took our classroom learning into reality by visiting the beach in Canet de Mar. We had been studying natural phenomena and strategies to manage natural disasters, like coastal erosion. We walked the length of the beach, stopping at different intervals to identify and observe the coastal management strategies in place. The children impressed me with their knowledge and understanding of the topic and made meaningful contributions to our discussions. We completed a reading comprehension to enhance our learning further. To conclude, we made sketches of the different management strategies and labelled them accurately. Although it was a cloudy day and the rain gave way, it didn't dampen our spirits as we ran for shelter and ate our snacks. Before our jaunt back to school, we had a chat and a sing song as we got cover from the showers. It was another magical moment!

On Monday, 17th June, we commenced our final week of fun before the holidays! We carried out an experiment related to our science and topic classes. This was no ordinary experiment - an extreme element of fun was injected through the use of two components - chocolate and ice-cream! By doing the experiment, we observed how lava (hot melted chocolate) cools and hardens as it flows down the mountain side (ice-cream)! As well as helping us to visualize how a volcano works, this experiment assisted us to put the theory into practice in relation to the properties of the materials unit that we covered in class. We observed how a solid turned to a liquid through the process of melting (solid bar of chocolate into liquid). We saw the water boiling and the processes of evaporation and condensation at work. Finally, we witnessed the liquid chocolate solidify when it came into contact with the freezing ice-cream. The children had a lot of fun and participated well for the duration of the lesson! As a reward for their diligent work during science and topic classes this term, they were allowed to devour the tasty treat!






#### **Key Stage II**

The interior of the salt mountain is covered in majestic salt formations jutting up from the ground and hanging down from the ceiling. We really enjoyed exploring the mines. We even got to taste some of the salt. It was an excellent day out!

We also enjoyed some pool days, a couple of trips to the beach and of course, we finished up the term with our epic end of year show. What a fantastic end to primary school we have had, now time to enjoy summer and relax!
